The special menu will be 'Build your own Pizza' How will this work?

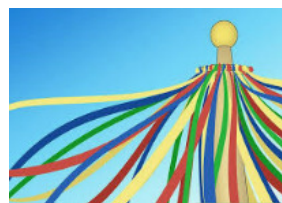
- The only choice available to order on parent pay is a cheese & tomato pizza.
- The choice of one hot topping will need to be made in class by the child on 16 May, the choices are as follows: beef (mince), pork sausage, tuna, veggie sausage or soya mince
- Children can have a plain cheese & tomato pizza if they prefer.
- We will let cook know what choice each child has made.
- If they wish, children can also choose up to two cold toppings from the salad bar at lunch time when collecting their pizza, the choices are: sweetcorn, tomatoes, peppers, or mushrooms

Please note that no other meals choices will be available.

School Minibus Service from September

We have had to make the decision to discontinue the After-School Minibus service from September 2019. When we originally initiated this service it was because we weren't able to provide an after-school club here at school. Since September 2018 Nanchedra Pre-School have provided an after school club and consequently the numbers using the bus have decreased considerably. It is no longer viable for us to run it.

We hope this does not cause too much inconvenience and we recommend the Pre-School After-School Club as an alternative.

Wednesday 8 May - PLASTIC FREE DAY!

This year, to celebrate the 93rd birthday of Sir David Attenborough, we are joining lots of other schools to take part in the '8th May Plastic-Free Day.'

Many of you will have seen coverage over the last couple of years of the dreadful levels of plastic pollution in our oceans, which is harming wildlife and even getting into our own food chain. Only 9% of the plastic waste we humans have created has been recycled, and around 8 millions tonnes of it enters the oceans every year, from littering, dumping and mishandling, and can hang around for hundreds of years.

To help our children understand the impact of plastic on the environment, we are going to have a day of refusing single-use plastic. We are asking that, where possible, children who have a packed lunch at school come in with no single-use plastic packaging in their lunch box - so no disposable bottles, crisp packets etc. Sandwiches and other lunch box contents could be wrapped in tin foil or come in a container (plastic such as Tupperware is reusable and is acceptable!), and please make sure your child has a reusable water bottle with them.

We hope that taking part in this day will help our children learn about how we can reduce the amount of plastic pollution endangering our wildlife and environment and to be aware of how simple switches to more environmentally friendly options can make a difference.

Joint Message from Nancledra Pre-School and School

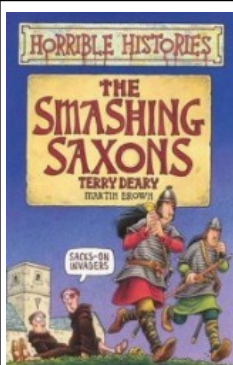
We understand that many parents and families will be aware that emergency services attended Nancledra School & Pre-school on Wednesday lunchtime.
