Arriving on Time!


We have noticed this week that a number of children are arriving late to school. All KS2 children need to be in their class by 8.55am at the latest to start their learning.

Applying for Places in Reception 2021

If you have a child who was born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017, you are now able to apply for a place in our Reception class for September 2021. You **must** apply for a place for your child by 15 January 2021.

Please note that having your child's name down on our list **does not** guarantee your child a place in our school, neither does attending Nancledra Pre-School.


