Please note: This will <u>not</u> be a tracksuit day for classes 3 and 4 and the children should wear their school uniform as normal.




We will be taking part in the comic Relief fundraising day next Friday and are inviting the children to

Information about Children Being Unwell

We would like to remind parents to check for fever and take children's temperatures for all ailments and illnesses, because a temperature is one of the symptoms of COVID-19. The key symptoms to look out for are:

- A high temperature **OR**
- A new cough where you keep on coughing. This means coughing a lot for more than an hour or three <u>or</u> more episodes of coughing in a day **OR**
- Losing <u>or</u> a change, to your sense of smell or taste

If your child <u>does have</u> a temperature **OR** one of the other symptoms (not necessarily all of them together) we are required to ask you to have them tested for COVID-19 by phoning 119 or visiting the NHS website.

COVID-19 Clinical Trial

We have been asked by the NIHR Clinical Research Network in the South West to share the following information with you about a clinical trail taking locally...

Study looking for parents and carers in Cornwall who may have been exposed to COVID-19

A COVID-19 antibody study for people who may have been exposed to the new coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) is now recruiting in the local area.

Mounts Bay Medical is taking part in a clinical research study called the STORM CHASER Study. This study is looking at how safe a combination of two investigational monoclonal antibodies is and if it works for the prevention of COVID-19 in adults.

We are looking for volunteers who are 18 years of age or older, who have been in contact with, or living in the same residence as, someone who is confirmed to be infected with SARS-CoV-2. You may be able to take part if you:

- are 18 years of age or older
- do not have a previously confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19
- have, in the past 8 days, been in contact with, or living in the same residence as, someone who is confirmed to be infected with SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19)
