peasant

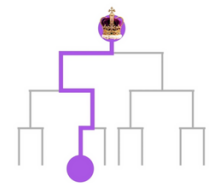
noun



Meaning
A person from history who lives off the land; who earns very little money; and who is not educated.

inherited

verb



Meaning
To receive something such as money after someone dies.

Meaning
Henry VIII made a new Church called the Church of England and he made himself the Head of it.

monarch

noun



Meaning
The **monarch** is the king, queen, emperor, or empress.

Meaning
Pieces of evidence about the past which give us clues as to what happened all those years ago.

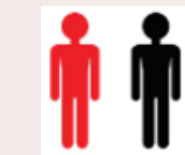
heir

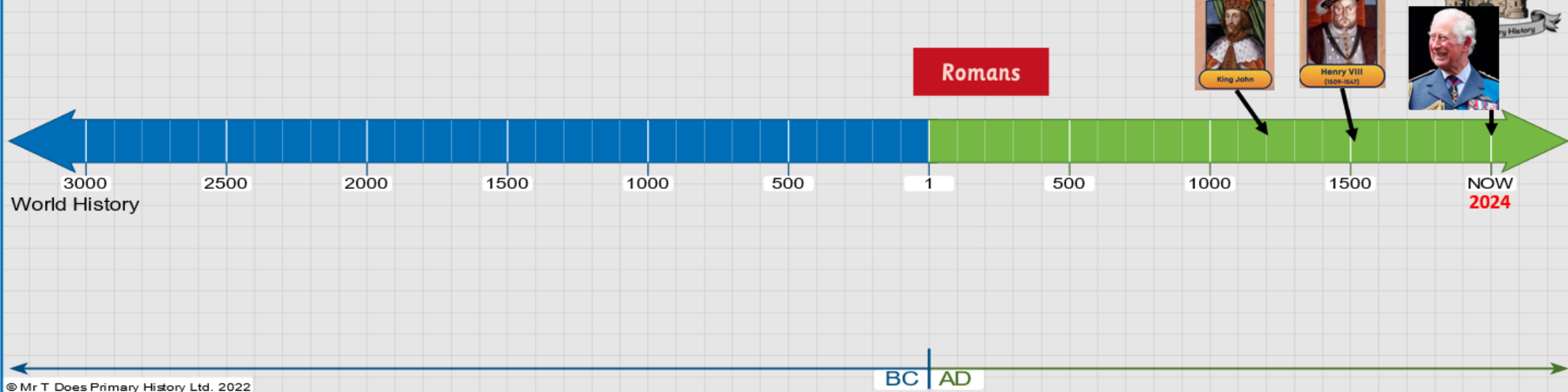
