



- Prior to 1914, tension was mounting in Europe with secret alliances.
- · The assassination of Archduke Ferdinand resulted in Austria-Hungary declaring war on Serbia.

Evidence

- Following the assassination, Austria-Hungary declared war on Serbia.
- Britain declared war on Germany on 4th August 1914, after Germany invaded Belgium.
- WWI was fought on land, at sea and in the air.
- On the Western Front, World War I was fought from trenches and what life was like in the trenches.
- The people on the 'Home Front', took up jobs in factories, farms, offices etc.
- The war ended 11th November 1918 when Germany and the allies signed a ceasefire.
- The Treaty of Versailles was signed in 1919.
- Over 15 million people were believed to have been killed during the war and many more injured.

Knowing about the Treaty of Versailles will help me when I study the causes of World War Two. Knowing about the 'Representation of People Act 'will support me when I learn about the Suffragette movement.
